PROGRAM

This seminar will focus on social work contributions to quality psychosocial care in long-term care facilities and the challenges and/or barriers faced by social workers as part of the interprofessional person-centered care team. The term psychosocial describes a constellation of social, mental health, and emotional needs and the care given to meet them. A broader, but related concept, quality of life, focuses on the nursing home residents' perspective on their total living experience in the home, not just their medical care. The psychosocial care domain is a multifaceted one because in addition to social workers, other nursing home care providers contribute to meeting psychosocial needs and enhancing quality of life. Also contributory to quality of life are the overall home atmosphere and processes.

Interprofessional collaboration in health care offers many rewards and challenges. Social workers have the ability to bring to the team a unique perspective concerning the residents to whom they provide care. The main concern is the tension between a clearly defined social work role and the necessity for fluidity of roles in interprofessional teams.

FROM INTERSTATE 95

Take the MD-175 W EXIT 41, toward Columbia. Merge onto MD-175 W/Rouse Pkwy. Turn slight right onto ramp to merge onto Columbia Gateway Dr. Follow approximately 1.5 miles to a left onto Samuel Morse Dr. *(If you reach Robert Fulton Dr. you've gone too far)*. 7090 is on the right and at the end of Samuel Morse Drive. Turn towards the office building. Follow the signs to go left around the building to the Handelman Conference Center. **The Conference Center is located at the rear of the building.**

FROM ROUTE 32

Take Exit 14 for Broken Land Pkwy. Merge onto Broken Land Pkwy. Turn right onto Snowden River Parkway. Immediately after the light at Oakland Mills Rd. use the right lane to take the ramp onto Robert Fulton Drive.
